#### 11.1 PRINCIPAL

- Sept. 4 Meet the Sec I teacher; went well, good attendance. Parents had opportunity to hear about curriculum & meet their child's Sec I HR teacher
- Sept. 13 Welcome Back BBQ; great turnout & weather. Kids & staff had a blast. Thank you to SLA for hard work organizing
- Sept. 20-22 senior level canoe camping trip to Algonquin Park
- Sept. 24 Open House. We had positive feedback about the flow of "traffic".
- Sept. 26-27 Sec I grade level trip; always great opportunity to build friendships over those 2 days
- Sept. 26 Attestation day; official count is 903
- Oct. 5-6 Qualifying exams: Approximately 500 students wrote the entrance exam. A little over 100 students applied but did not show up to write the exam. Some speculation as to whether students wrote on the same day in other (private) schools.
- Difficulty with teaching vacancies this year, particularly with French language courses (FLM, études sociales, et mathématiques), as there is currently a province-wide shortage of qualified teachers, not to mention those who are proficient in French. All vacancies are now filled. For the History and Math courses, teachers are offering remediation both after school and at lunch until students are caught up. With respect to the new French teacher, who started earlier this week, she will be accompanied by a full-time tutor (in the process of hiring) to ensure that students are caught up. Remediation will be organized shortly.
