1. Welcome

3. Ms. Jennings addressed the board.

Ms. Jennings is visiting many governing boards. She spoke of the recent trusteeship and the government's actions. The government may extend the mandate of the trusteeship for another 6 months. She spoke about the government and their response to the request for expansion and the new auditorium.

K. Bodanis asked if the board had any other deficiencies, apart from the financial one Ms. Jennings had mentioned. Ms. Jennings replied as an example that there are some IT issues with accounting at the adult centers.

7. Business arising from the last meeting

7.1 Sexuality Education program

C. Tannous said that the exemption process has been sent out (forms on p. 2 must be filled out). Parents can only request exemptions from certain parts of the curriculum, not the entire program. The document must be filled out for each child being exempted. Parents must have a meeting with administration.

7.2 CODE OF ETHICS - RWA CELL PHONE POLICY REVIEW

Ms. Mason, guest parent, addressed the board. The code of conduct does not reflect actual practice in the school. As an example, Ms. Mason pointed out that cell phones should be left in lockers and that there could be an exception. She suggested that the code of conduct should be reviewed for this. If students are expected to participate in an activity that requires a device, then the school should furnish it as it is now an educational tool.

After a long exchange of idea it was suggested that we create a subcommittee to review this policy

Secondary 2-3 students, as well as the Jazz and Honour Bands performed for parents and staff under the leadership of Ms. Purdy, Mr. Van Alphen and Mr. Bowles (substitute teacher). As always, spectators were blown away by our students' talent.
- CARNIVAL DAY: On January 21, our SLA students organized a variety of activities for our student body including tubing, hockey, and Cabane à Sucre visit, to name but a few. We would like to thank Mr. Zigby for leading the SLA students in this well-attended and appreciated activity day.
