Our Secondary I Parent Seminars kicked off this year on October 3, with an informative presentation by our MindPOP team, Mr. Mateus and Ms. Almeida. The seminar focused on teenage development and students' transition to high school, particularly to Royal West Academy. About 100 parents were present at this presentation on the workings of the adolescent mind. The next seminar will take place on November 6, 2018, at 7 PM in the school auditorium. All Secondary I parents are strongly encouraged to attend.

were able to visit representatives from two CEGEPs or universities of their choice for 25-minute presentations on the programs offered in those institutions. A third session, over 30 minutes, allowed students and parents to ask individual questions of all the CEGEPS and universities present. Over 200 students and parents were in attendance. We would like to thank Ms. Klisouris and Ms. Dimopoulos for organizing the event.

Special thanks to Ms. Di Pietro, Ms. Dimopoulos, and Ms. Klisouris for their work in preparing students for the selection process.

- Alumni Liaison: promote our named chair campaign for graduates and look for ways to obtain alumni donations.
- Volunteer Coordination: coordinate volunteers to help out at various school events, whether it

- be speaking about the Foundation or staffing a table selling merchandise.
- Merchandise Coordination: help identify items that our community would like to purchase (we already sell mugs, tuques, bags, and several other items), find a distributor, and start selling them (via the website or at school events).
- Donor Relations: track donations (financial or in kind) and ensure that tax receipts, etc. are distributed as appropriate. Ensure the list of donors on the website and school display screens are kept up-to-date.

Are there any other ways you can help? (I'm sure there are.) If you have an idea, let us know.

Our students are already benefiting from the money raised in this campaign as well as the new gym campaign raised by parent volunteers who are no longer at the school. Volunteers today will continue to benefit our students and the students going forward.
