Most of you will remember Mr. Jan Mateus, who recently retired after 23 years as a guidance counsellor at RWA. Mr. Mateus has agreed to return on a part-time basis to work with our students in the MindPOP program. We are grateful for his dedication to supporting our students.

This school year began on an enthusiastic note, with the Student Life Association welcoming the Secondary I students at our annual Orientation on August 29. The SLA members organized activities and tours of the school in the hope that students would be well prepared for their first day of school. Special thanks to our co-Presidents Jennifer Lynch and Sam Galler for their leadership in making this event possible.

The RWA Foundation organized our third annual Royal West Academy Start of Year Celebration, which took place on September 16. Volunteers dedicated hundreds of hours toward the organization of this event.

Students, parents, staff, and community members were treated to large inflatable games, great food and beverages, and a visit from the SPVM's Mounted Police. The evening proved to be a huge success with proceeds going to the RWA Auditorium Renovation Project.

Special thanks to Kirk Kelly (parent of a 2015 graduate), Mitch White, and Sarah Goblot for their leadership in organizing this memorable event!

Once again, during the first week of school, staff members were visible in their brightly coloured vests, directing the student pedestrian traffic from the Montréal-Ouest train station. Pedestrian safety procedures were also reviewed at our annual start of year assembly. We ask that parents discuss the issue of traffic safety with their child(ren). Please note that there are three different commuter trains running through the Montréal-Ouest train station. Assume that there may be more than one train coming through at a time. Remember to look both ways, cross the roads only at the crosswalks specified for students, stay alert, do not wear headphones, and practice safety first!

In addition, there are large numbers of students boarding the STM buses after school. It is important to line up and board the bus in an orderly fashion, so that



no one gets hurt. Parent drivers are reminded that the drop-off and pick-up of students takes place **ON EASTON AVENUE ONLY!** Easton Avenue is the only safe drop-off area for students. Ainslie Road is a No Stopping Zone. If you drop off your child on Ainslie, you risk receiving an \$85 ticket from Public Security. Also, please note that the **Easton Avenue is a one-way street leading away from Westminster Avenue South**.

Therefore, drivers accessing Easton from Westminster to drop off their child on that side of the school must continue around the block to Ainslie in order to get back onto Westminster. This is being done to ensure the public's security as traffic in the area increases due to the closure of the Saint-Jacques exit off of Highway 20. We ask that parents remain vigilant while navigating this area. Please keep our students and staff safe!

Our Meet the Secondary I Teacher Evening was held on September 7. Despite an intense heat wave, over 200 parents attended this event. Parents were given short presentations by teachers from all subject domains including MindPOP. They also had an opportunity to hear from the administration, the Secondary I homeroom teachers, and our school guidance department. We know that the transition to high school may be difficult. We highly recommend that students should have a period of relaxing downtime! Parents are encouraged to ensure that their child **NOT** have a cell phone or computer available during times of rest. Cell phones should not be used as alarm clocks. The distractions far outweigh the benefits.

Members of our three major parent organizations—RWA Home & School, RWA Foundation, and RWA Governing Board—also gave presentations and welcomed parents to Royal West Academy. On September 22–23, over 160 students participated in our annual Secondary I Trip to the Laurentians. Special thanks to our trip organizers, Mme Bourdeau and Mme Dupaul, and the teacher chaperones for their time and effort in making these trips possible.

On September 19, Royal West Academy opened its doors to over 1000 visitors at our annual Open House. Special thanks to the volunteer students and parents who were great ambassadors for RWA. Qualifying tests were written on September 24 and 25. Special thanks to Mr. Mateus, Ms. Wineberg, Ms. Dimopoulos, Ms. Di Pietro, Ms. Taylor, and our student monitors for all their hard work in organizing and administering these tests.

At the RWA Governing Board's annual general meeting on September 29, the following parents were elected to two-year terms as parent representatives: Mr. Ryan Ortiz, Ms. Lori Rinaldi, Ms. Anne Monereau, and Ms. Arzine Brochu. These four members will join parents in the second year of their two-year term: Mr. Michael Delis, Mr. Michael Mendelson, Mr. Norm Gharibian, and Ms. Deidre Dimock. Mr. Gharibian was also elected as the Regional/CPC Delegate for Royal West Academy. Serving as Alternate Delegate will be Ms. Monereau.

The Governing Board will hold its first meeting on October 19, 2016 at 7 PM in the school library. At that time, the Governing Board will decide on the dates for all future meetings. Meetings are open to the public and a question period is always part of the agenda. Minutes from all meetings can be found on the RWA website.

The next meeting for the RWA Home & School Association will be on October 18, 2016 at 7:30 PM. The Home & School provides much needed funds for pedagogical materials, special events, and building improvements. With your help, the Home & School will undoubtedly be in a position to make many more contributions that will enhance your child's educational experience at RWA. All our parents are encouraged to get involved!

We continue to make improvements to our facilities. Thanks to the Home & School and the EMSB, over 700 new lockers were installed this September. Delays in

the manufacturing of the lockers meant that some students did not have lockers during the first week of school, an inconvenience that our students handled extremely well. Over 50 years of rust and deterioration will be replaced by beautiful and functional lockers that meet our students' needs. Functional and aesthetically pleasing improvements were also made to our Art Room (103) thanks to the generosity and hard work of Mr. Michael Mendelson and Mr. Daniel Rametta from the Home & School. Funding for this project was made possible after schools received surplus budget allocations from the EMSB. This summer also saw a masonry project completed on the main building by the Material Resources Department.

Royal West Academy has a long tradition of acceptance, awareness, and action on social justice issues. In that spirit, RWA has responded to requests from our students to include an all-gender washroom in the second floor west wing area of the school. Students uncomfortable with using this space can still use six gender-specific washrooms located throughout the school. Royal West Academy has also added private changing stalls for students in Physical Education classes. Surplus budgets from the EMSB also contributed to this improvement of our locker room facilities. We are extremely proud of how our community has responded to these important changes.

As many of you already know, our parents have been extremely generous with their time to improve the physical environment of our school. Once again this year, the Home & School will be seeking parent volunteers to continue the great work by painting other areas of the building. Please stay tuned for details in the coming weeks.

Finally, RWA would like to congratulate Esme Bale, a Secondary IV student who is presently featured in a special marketing campaign promoting the EMSB's slogan "Être bilingue, c'est gagnant!". Television commercials, signage, and promotional items help promote the fact that being bilingual represents a winning formula for Montrealers.

SHARING THE STAGE WITH YOU.

The Royal West Academy Foundation was incorporated in 1998 by parent volunteers and was mandated to raise the funding for three capital improvement projects: a new gym, renovation of the auditorium, and the enlargement of the current library. The gym campaign has been completed—\$2 million was raised for what we now call the "new gym". The new gym is a vital part of Royal West Academy's life that the students benefit from on a daily basis.

Our next project is to transform the current 80-year-old auditorium into a performing arts centre. Raising \$2.2 million is the largest and most ambitious public school campaign ever. But with your help we can achieve it. The auditorium is used every day of the week for band practices, theatre rehearsals, musicals, dance shows, recitals, model UN debates, and assemblies.

Over the last three years, we have raised over \$400,000 through hockey raffle campaigns, Start Of The Year celebrations, and theatre events. Because we've broken down the project into stages (no pun intended), instead of waiting to achieve all the necessary funding, the money that raised so far has already been invested in a new \$80,000 sound and theatre light system and \$14,000 skyjack, allowing our teachers and students to adjust the sounds and lights for every production and event in the auditorium.

Engineers and architects have finalized \$200,000 worth of plans that are required for the renovations. With school commissioner Mr. Joe Lalla's help at the EMSB, we've asked the province for funds to pay for most of the rest of the project. We are proud to report that the Government has announced RWA is in line to receive a \$500,000 grant towards this project. We are investing the funds in your children so please help us raise the balance.

We need to keep making progress—the next stage is air conditioning. If you have ever been in the auditorium for a meeting or event on a warm evening, then you

know why. Imagine what it's like in the day when the sun shines down on this very room. Every day, our kids work in the auditorium; they write their exams in the auditorium. They deserve better. We need your help to get that air conditioning installed by next summer.
