The first Governing Board meeting was held on October 24. Elections took place and the positions were filled as follows:

Interview: Ms. Angela Vaudry

On October 24, I interviewed the newest addition to the Royal West Academy family, Ms. Angela Vaudry. Being our new principal, it seemed fitting to both welcome her and get to know her better. Walking into her office, I felt a kind of warmth and kindness putting me at ease, followed by a personality



that's all too kind, with a very interesting background. Being a principal is a tough job, with kids always wanting to rebel against them because of their duty to enforce strict rules, but with Ms. Vaudry I noticed that although she takes her job seriously, she does her best to make school an enjoyable place for all.

I began with the casual conversation starter, "How are you liking Royal West so far?" So far she's enjoying it. I later asked which schools Ms. Vaudry has worked at previously, with her stating, "I taught for about seven years at James Lyng High School ... I was [vice-principal] at Vincent Massey ... for about three years ... principal at James Lyng for three years ... and then most recently for the last three years I've been at John Grant and Links special needs schools."

Obviously this isn't Ms. Vaudry's first role in an administrative position, having worked at different schools all over Montreal. I asked her which high school she attended. She graduated high school at Thomas D'Arcy McGee Centre for the Fine and Performing Arts, where she studied art and dance. Following high school she studied in the arts at Dawson College, then studied Art Education at Concordia University. After hearing she studied art, I asked Ms. Vaudry why she had decided to follow more of an administrative role. Due to her starting university at age 26 and already being a mother, she didn't have time to establish herself; she also liked the nurturing aspect of a teacher, so an art



teacher she became, saying, "My two loves ... the best of two worlds." When asked about uniforms, she understands the pros and cons of them at school having worn one for two years, but she feels it "lends professionalism to the class."

Being a student in Secondary V, I wondered what kind of advice Ms. Vaudry had in store for us, knowing that next year we would be attending CEGEP. She simply stated, "Figure out what it is they want to do, because we all have interests, but not just what you think you should do, but what you want to do ... Only by experiencing it [will] you really get a sense if you have skills in it or have interests in it."

Ms. Vaudry really does her best to make kids feel at home, and if you were to ask students who she has taught, they will say that she has a very "human" side to her. She goes on to say that, in the workplace, she does her best to make new relationships with her coworkers, but finds it hard to find someone that actually understands her, especially since she's the principal. She doesn't like the whole hierarchy triangle, but rather thinks of all her peers as equals and hopes to form strong bonds with staff who don't just think of her as a boss.

I then asked about hobbies that Ms. Vaudry likes and what she's like outside of school. It turns out she likes her sci-fi—who would've thought she's obsessed with Star Wars? One of her sons is even named Harrison, after Harrision Ford, which I think is pretty cool. Besides her art and Star Wars, she likes to crochet, and has been doing a lot of research on her ancestry tree, which is fascinating to see who you were related too. She actually found out she has an ancestor who has a statue in Quebec City.

To end of the pleasant interview with Ms. Vaudry I asked if she had any advice to offer to the RWA family, to which she says, "Have fun, you guys are all under 17 years old. If you don't have fun now, you're not going to have fun when you're my age ... when it's time to be serious, you have to be serious, but you have to balance that in your life."
