## REMEMBRANCE DAY & POPPIES

In honour of Veteran's Week and Remembrance Day, poppies will be available in the foyer at lunch Nov 8<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>. Any donations are welcome, and much appreciated. Poppies will also be available during homeroom on Nov 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Where did it all begin?** Poppies were the flowers which grew on the battlefields after WWI ended. In 1921, The Royal British Legion began selling poppies to raise money for those whose lives had been affected by the war. In 1922, a factory was set up where disabled veterans were employed to make the poppies. This factory is still running – producing millions of poppies each year. For one hundred years, the poppy has been a symbol of remembering, not just those who gave their lives in WWI, but all who have sacrificed on behalf of their country. The money raised from these donations is used to help those who served and their loved ones, whose lives have been changed by wars.

RWA will have a virtual Remembrance Day ceremony at the beginning of period 3 on Nov 11<sup>th</sup> to pay respect to those who served, those who continue to serve, and those who have lost their lives.
