



Governing Board Report

On December 13, the Governing Board (GB) held a special meeting to approve Royal West Academy's renewal application for its Article 240 (Education Act) status.

Since the beginning of 2022, the GB has held two meetings on January 17 and February 22. The materials discussed during our meetings are available on the RWA website at http://www.royalwestacademy.com/ under the "Governing Board" tab.

During our meeting on February 22, we discussed the issue of the Québec Government's recently announced decision to, effective March 7, 2022 (i.e., after the RWA spring break), lift the requirement for students to wear masks in classrooms while seated at their desks—the requirement for masks while circulating in classrooms and in common areas will remain in place. The GB parents believe that our school, including our student
