Course description:

The grade seven curriculum is designed for students to learn the basic notions of the visual arts such as: drawing from observation, proportions, shading and the elements of art (line, shape, form, space, texture, value, color). Throughout the short term in which they experience the visual arts, they will learn various art techniques and experiment with different basic materials.

Students will also develop their critical thinking and their appreciation for the visual arts by discussing and criticizing the art works of Canadian artists as well as artists from different cultural and ethnic backgrounds. Students will be evaluated in 2 competencies throughout the art rotation and will be clearly given the criteria of evaluation at the beginning of each assignment and/or project.

Competencies description:

C1: CREATES PERSONAL AND MEDIA IMAGES. Students will be evaluated based on in-class and take-home assignments that reinforce the notions viewed in class while being guided to produce work that has a personal connection to them. Students will also be encouraged to create artwork that delivers a specific message to a specific audience. It also refers to any artwork that has been inspired by a social event, movement or environmental issue.

C2: APPRECIATES WORKS OF ART. Students are evaluated upon their capacity to express their opinion about an artwork both orally and written. They will analyze and criticize works of art considering specific elements and criteria.

Additional information:

- Students are responsible for their success in this course by keeping track of the deadlines and evaluation criteria for each assignment and/or project, to facilitate this process students must join the SEC 1 ART Google Classroom.
- **Assignments handed in late with no valid justification will be penalized 10% per day. A parent or guardian must sign all evaluated assignments.**
- Students are welcome to work in the art studio to finish projects or to seek guidance during studio time.
- Students must respect studio etiquette at all times: respect their fellow art peers and teacher, the art materials and classroom furniture.
