# ABOUT ROYAL WEST ACADEMY AND RWA FOUNDATION

The mission of the Royal West Academy Foundation is to raise funds for capital improvement projects mandated by the administration of Royal West Academy and its Governing Board.

Volunteer parents incorporated the RWA Foundation in 1997 to raise funds for essential capital improvement projects: the construction of a new gymnasium, the renovation of the auditorium, and the enlargement of the library. These projects have reached completion and the Foundation has now been mandated to modernize the school's classrooms in line with modern learning and teaching methods that encourage collaboration, flexibility, and adaptation to different learning styles.

Royal West is a high-achieving public school and provides a well-rounded French immersion education to a diverse student body and represents a viable alternative to private education. We are continuously driven to improve — measured not only by our students' achievements, but by their learning environment as well. Our goal: students who graduate as independent, knowledgeable, versatile, bilingual, and creative individuals well-equipped to handle life's challenges and opportunities.

Consistently ranking at the top of public schools in the province, Royal West Academy features enriched French, Science, Math, Music, Drama, and Visual Arts programs that attract academically and artistically gifted students from across Greater Montreal. All students follow the Enriched or Accelerated Math program.

Nearly 100% of Royal West students continue with higher education. All students must participate annually in cultural, community and athletic extracurricular activities. Every year, student life is enriched by international exchanges, and trips to underdeveloped countries are part of the school's global awareness policy.

#### A few facts about RWA:

- o Enrolment is limited to 880 students.
- o 600 apply annually for Grade 7 and the top 180 are accepted.
- o Admission depends partly on the results of an entrance exam and interview.
- Girls and boys are equally represented.
- The student body mirrors the ethnic, cultural, and economic mosaic of Montreal.
- Students in accelerated French graduate with a French certification and automatically qualify for French CEGEP.



# PROMOTING INDIVIDUALIZED LEARNING

Educators today are embracing the importance of teaching students to work together to solve problems and complete projects, just like they will in the adult world. The days of students sitting at a desk all day listening to a teacher at the front of the room are increasingly behind us. Modern teaching and learning methods require new and innovative classroom design. Classroom furniture needs to be more portable in order to form multiple types of group configurations. Current Royal West Academy classrooms use seating arrangements and technology that date back to the 1950s. Increasingly, tables are being used rather than single-seat desks. Changing up the furniture arrangement automatically encourages greater collaboration.

In addition, just like other schools, Royal Wrest Academy caters to students with Individualized Education programs, as well as students who suffer from ADHD and/or who are diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder.

By embracing classroom modernization and active learning spaces, learning at RWA will become even more dynamic, individualized, and active. Physical learning environment has an enormous impact on both student and teacher mindsets.

Concordia University, McGill University, Trafalgar school for girls are just a few respected Montreal institutions who have embraced Active Learning Classrooms.



## **BENEFITS TO OUR STUDENTS AND STAFF**

Classroom redesign at RWA will have the power to impact students' well-being and motivation. As students spend large chunks of time in school, classrooms should be welcoming and warm to boost morale. Modernization of classrooms with flexible seating will:

- ✓ Facilitate individualized learning
- ✓ Create opportunities for collaboration and creation
- ✓ Strengthen relationships within the classroom
- ✓ Improve student exchanges during group work
- Responding to the needs of different teaching subjects or activities
- ✓ Increase student motivation and engagement

This environment will help to develop communication and critical thinking skills. Flexible groupings give students the opportunity to work with their peers, to learn and to contribute. When students work in groups, they learn to work independently and in cooperation with a variety of personalities.

Modern learning environments have a wide variety of benefits, including increased student engagement and motivation, stronger relationships with peers and teachers, enhanced collaboration and an increased sense among students that they have ownership over their own learning.

Teachers can decide what they need most to improve their teaching spaces. We want to ensure they can continue to do their job well, in ways that level power dynamics within the classroom and promote engagement; teacher input is key.

Students mix and match in different groups. This makes students accountable for sharing information and creates space for students who are less comfortable speaking in large groups to contribute. With static desks, students tend to cluster with the same peers and sit in the same place. Flexible set-ups allow for more engagement, more discussion, more cross-pollination, and the necessary movement to keep kids awake! Changes like this can also break down the walls of the classroom entirely.



# **ECOLOGICAL CONSIDERATIONS**

RWA will select a supplier that has identified sustainable green measures as guidelines and priorities to minimize our impact on the environment.

Products must be designed to ensure sustainability of at least 10 years in a rigorous academic or public use. The durability of the products purchased is an environmentally important principle for the long-term reduction in waste. Products are ANSI (American National Standards Institute) and BIFMA (Business and Institutional Furniture Manufacturers Association) tested and approved.

Manufacturers must be chosen for their sustainability, lean and recycling methods to reduce the impact our products have on the environment from manufacture to end user.

GREENGUARD and SCS certifications are designed to protect human health and improve quality of life by enhancing indoor air quality and reducing people's exposure to chemicals and other pollutants. Reducing emissions of VOC's, formaldehyde and phthalates from furniture ensure these products are safe for use in schools and offices as well as protecting the environment. Manufacturers are chosen that are SCS and/or GREENGUARD certified. ANSI/BIFMA testing ensures that a product meets durability cycle testing and will stand up in the environment for which it is intended.

The school plans to re-use existing furniture that will be replaced through the campaign. In addition, RWA has a \$4000 annual budget to replace furniture. Some of those funds will be re-directed to other important teacher and student needs.


For furniture that cannot be reused, the school can possibly generate revenue and/or reduce the environmental impact by recycling the materials.





#### OUR COMMUNITY OF PARENTS AND DONORS

The Active Learning Classroom Campaign was launched November 2022 to parents and donors of Royal West Academy and the response has been overwhelming. However, we know that we need to reach out to the greater Montreal community's business and philanthropic leaders to reach our objective over the life of this multi-year campaign.





# **FUNDING REQUEST**

Given the cost of modernizing classrooms to fit today's pedagogical needs, the RWA Foundation is considering a phased approach, with fundraising efforts in year 1, focusing on the modernization of 3 classrooms.

3 Classrooms have been chosen for their application to a maximum number of students with input from the teachers who use the classrooms most.

During the 2022-2023 school year, the objective of this pilot project is to raise \$80,000 for 3 classrooms:

- o Room 301 Math and Science
- o Room 209 English and Drama
- o Room 313 History and Ethics

The rollout of the campaign will take place over several years based on the priorities of the school.




# **ROOM 301 – MATH AND SCIENCE**



Currently Room 301 has 34 desks with attached chairs. The attached chair makes it difficult to form groups of students, as there are a limited number of configurations that function within the space. The walls of the classroom are a mix of painted-over corkboard, blackboards, and old whiteboards. The room is used for Science and Mathematics courses.

#### **ROOM 209 – ENGLISH AND DRAMA**


#### **Current Layout**



An updated English language arts room will allow for better student exchanges during writing activities and projects.
Collaboration between students is essential in any language course. The variety of seating arrangements will allow smaller and larger groups to work together much more effectively.

The easy mobility of these proposed tables will also make it much easier to create the space needed in a drama class where students are performing skits and doing presentations in front of the class.
