Fundraising for RWA Alumni



Ever had the incredible chance to go back a quarter century and immerse yourself in the lives of the students and staff at Royal West Academy?

Twenty-five years ago, a time capsule was ceremoniously buried near our school entrance in the presence of the Mayor of Montreal West and other dignitaries. Consequently, 2023 holds special significance as a year in which we can learn about our past and appreciate where we stand today. It is also the 25th anniversary of the EMSB, marking not only a celebration of our school's rich history but also of our tight-knit school community. Back then, Mr. S. Nemeth was an RWA student who helped bury the capsule and Mr. A. Diacoumacos was a first-year teacher! On November 2, Mr. Diacoumacos proudly directed the archeological digs. Despite having no markers, the capsule was found and dug up using old pictures and pure deduction. The opening ceremony took place two weeks later with the students, Mr. Diacoumacos, and staff members in attendance. As Mr. S. Manstavich accurately put it, "The time capsule is a snapshot in time."

To the tune of the Beatles and loud cheers, the time capsule lid was opened, revealing a treasure trove of historical artifacts: Newspapers, magazines and CDs from another era. Also revealed were photo albums, a gold environmental trophy, and a yearbook just to name a few. Mr. Diacoumacos filled us in on some of the historical importance of each item. For instance, a Canadian hockey magazine prompted him to inquire about the last time the Habs won a trophy.

All in all, the time capsule accomplished its goal of giving us a glimpse into 1998 when we students were not even born yet.
