Black Canadian Trailblazers and Changemakers - Did you know?

Mairuth Sarsfield was from Little Burgundy (Montreal). She was a Canadian activist, diplomat, journalist, researcher and television personality, as well as an accomplished broadcaster, civil servant, and best-selling author. Among her many accomplishments, she was the first Black woman to sit on the board of directors of the CBC.Ms Sarsfield's work has been credited as part of a movement to celebrate an acknowledge Black Canadian writers, history and culture that runs through contemporary fiction writers today.
