Black Canadian Trailblazers and Changemakers - Did you know?

Charles Roach moved to Canada from Trinidad and Tobago in 1955. He was a lawyer, activist, and community leader who fought for social justice and equality. Mr. Roach became one of the first Black Lawyers in Canada and played a crucial role in the development of anti-discrimination laws in Canada. He co-founded the Black Action Defense Committee (BADC) in Toronto, an organization dedicated to fighting police brutality and racial profiling, and was involved in various civil rights movements, including the civil rights movement in the United States, which led him to work with activists such as Martin Luther King Jr. and Malcolm X.

Mr. Roach's activism and advocacy work have left a lasting impact on Canada's social justice landscape. He received numerous awards and honors, including the Order of Canada in 2014, which recognized his contributions to human rights and social justice.

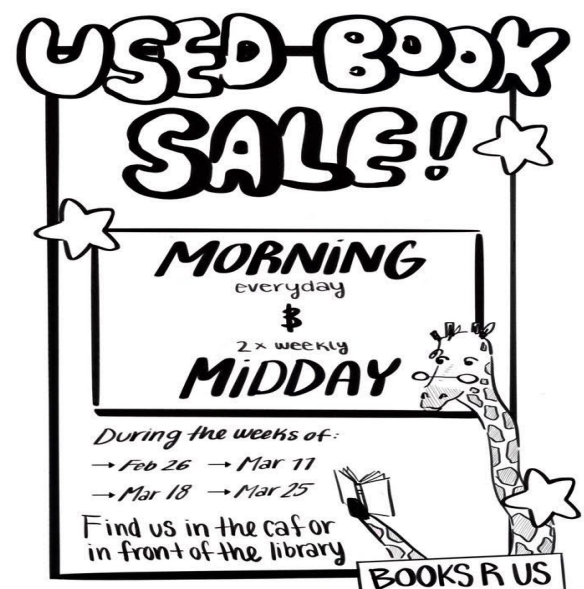
Used book sale at RWA
